As someone who has spent a lifetime in industry, I also hope that curiosity about how your designs on the page can become reality through putting ink on paper and binding the product will


also inspire some of you to look at the manufacturing side of our trade.



To consider creating a longform publication covering every aspect of mental health among her contemporaries was inspired; the 2021 edition of *The Wall*, the end result is outstanding. Alex captures the very essence of 'tomorrow's talent'. We can't help feeling Terry Mansfield would warmly endorse her winning this inaugural award.

### **About Terry**

Terry Mansfield was one of our competition's founding members and a giant in the publishing industry – during an illustrious career spanning more than 65 years he rose to be President and CEO of the prestigious Hearst Magazines, whose publications include *ELLE*, *Harper's Bazaar* and *Cosmopolitan*.

Shine's most passionate supporter, Terry was a firm believer in tomorrow's talent (a phrase he coined) and worked tirelessly to find sponsorship and support for the competition to help young people achieve their maximum potential.

Tragically, Terry contracted coronavirus just before the first lockdown in 2020 and died a few weeks later. With the support of his family, we have set up this award in his name as an enduring tribute to a remarkable, generoushearted and inspirational man.
